Kansas Hay Market Report

Compared to the last report, demand remains low to moderate for all hay and prices are soft for all regions. There still seems to be no interest in buying and no new crop pricing has been reported as folks are trying to get rid of or use up their old crop before committing to new crop. Many areas are reporting they could use a rain, with warm and windy conditions exacerbating the situation. Contributors state that the wheat is doing okay but will go backwards in a hurry without moisture. Alfalfa producers are spraying for weevil as the wind allows and some have begun irrigating. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor for April 2nd, locally heavy precipitation (more than one inch) led to targeted improvements across southeastern Kansas. Soil moisture supported a large increase in abnormal dryness (D0) across southwestern Kansas along with a slight expansion of moderate drought (D1) to the west of Wichita. The categorical percent area for abnormally dry conditions (D0) increased to 40%, moderate drought (D1) remained near 27%, severe drought (D2) remained just under 2%, and no extreme drought (D3) or exceptional drought (D4) was recorded.

Veterinarians detail ear tag, tattoo equipment and best practices

Individual identification of cattle is important for many reasons, making it possible to identify a number of important management aspects.

“Common variables to track include body condition scoring, calving date, ease of calving, weaning weight and average daily gain, milk production, vaccination/processing date and products used, and tracking animal health and treatments. These records allow producers to make appropriate management decisions,” says Tony Hawkins, DVM, Valley Vet Supply consulting veterinarian.

Knowing individual animal treatment is essential for record-keeping purposes. Importantly, the Beef Quality Assurance (BQA) program places a high emphasis on proper record keeping, including individual animal identification. “We all know the importance of adhering to BQA guidelines, so we can continue to produce high-quality, safe beef that consumers will trust to feed their families,” Dr. Hawkins adds.

Let’s review ear tag and tattoo equipment, and application best practices.

Ear Tag

There are many ear tag options available: colors, retention method, numbered versus blank, engravable, electronic identification (EID), also referred to as radio frequency identification (RFID) – the list goes on, Dr. Hawkins outlined.

When applying tags, you’ll need ear tag(s) of choice, the correct applicator, a tag removal knife and pen (for blank

tags), disinfectant solution, and for safety, a chute and halter.

Best Practices

- Make sure you have the correct tag applicator, recommends Julia Herman, DVM, MS, beef cattle specialist veterinarian with the National Cattlemen’s Beef Association (NCBA). “There are many styles of ear tags and they each have their own applicator. Confirm you have the correct applicators for the tag you are using before herd work.”
- “Clean ears are ideal. Placing a tag in a muddy ear could introduce dirt or bacteria into the site. This can cause an infection or abscess, and the tag could fall out later,” explains Dr. Herman.
- Place tags into the middle third of the ear; between the upper and lower ribs is the strongest part of the ear. This will prevent tags from being ripped out when cattle end up in the brush or trees.
- RFID tags are easiest when read with a stick reader or wand but can still be read if animals are properly restrained. Wands allow fast reading and data management. Ensure the button is on the inside of the ear and the visual panel is on the outside of the ear when applying.

Tattoo

“A tattoo makes a permanent form of identification – it is often required for registration with breed associations, so seed-stock producers should tattoo their cattle,” recommends Dr. Hawkins. “In addition to this, it can make an excellent ‘backup’ form of identification for commercial producers.” For example, Dr. Hawkins shared that if an animal loses their ear tag, you can reference the tattoo number and use your records to reapply the correct ear tag number.

When applying a tattoo, you will need tattoo pliers, tattoo digits, tattoo ink, paper towels or a cloth, toothbrush, rubbing alcohol, thick paper/cardboard, disposable gloves and for safety, a halter and a chute.

Best Practices

- If you have registered cattle, talk with your breed association and follow their guidelines for tattoos, recommends Dr. Herman. Work with your veterinarian if you have questions.
- Ensure cattle are properly restrained in a chute (a fitting chute is not recommended.)
- Clean the ear using paper towels or gauze and rubbing alcohol to help avoid infection and potentially spreading a virus from one animal to the next. Alcohol is the recommended disinfectant when tattooing – using soap, iodine or chlorhexidine can cause the tattoo ink to smear and not stick.
- Before tattooing the ear, you can make a test run to ensure proper placement – use the tattoo on the thick cardboard to make sure digits line up.
- Dr. Herman recommends wearing rubber or disposable gloves when tattooing for biosecurity and to keep hands clean. “My preference is to clean the ear, put the ink directly into the ear where you’ll put the tattoo, and firmly close the pliers to press ink into the tissue. Next, I have a toothbrush that I use to rub ink into the tattoo holes. Then, I place the applicator into a cup or bucket with alcohol in it, so it’s disinfected between animals.”
- The tattoo should last years, so make sure you have firm, even pressure when pressing

the applicator together on the ear. Apply the tattoo in the unhaird portion of the inner ear away from where hair is growing. The hair follicles will grow where the tattoo was placed, which will cause fading. Producers may need to check back for legibility over time.

Dr. Herman encourages producers to always emphasize human safety when tagging or tattooing and working around the head of these animals. Make

sure cattle are restrained appropriately, and if needed, use a halter to help improve safety and placement of the tag and tattoo.

“A well-thought identification program provides the opportunity for producers to keep accurate records, which will ultimately optimize production and profitability,” said Dr. Hawkins.

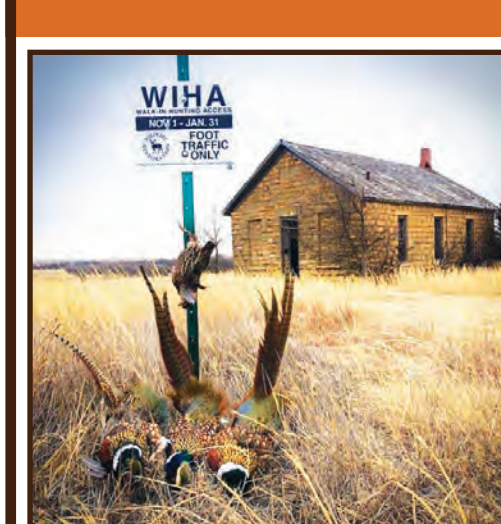

Public Hunting Access & Your Land



WHAT IS IT? The Walk-In Hunting Access program makes private land available for public hunting through a lease agreement between the Kansas Department of Wildlife & Parks and Kansas landowners. Participating landowners receive payments which vary with the number of acres, quality of habitat, and length of the lease access period. The department posts signs on the land, produces maps of the properties for hunters, and patrols the areas. The WIHA program has been very successful, growing each year since its start in 1995.

WHO CAN QUALIFY? Almost anyone who owns or leases land with upland game, deer, waterfowl and other hunting opportunities can qualify. This includes resident landowners, absentee landowners, tenant farmers, estate managers, trust managers, and others who manage privately owned land.

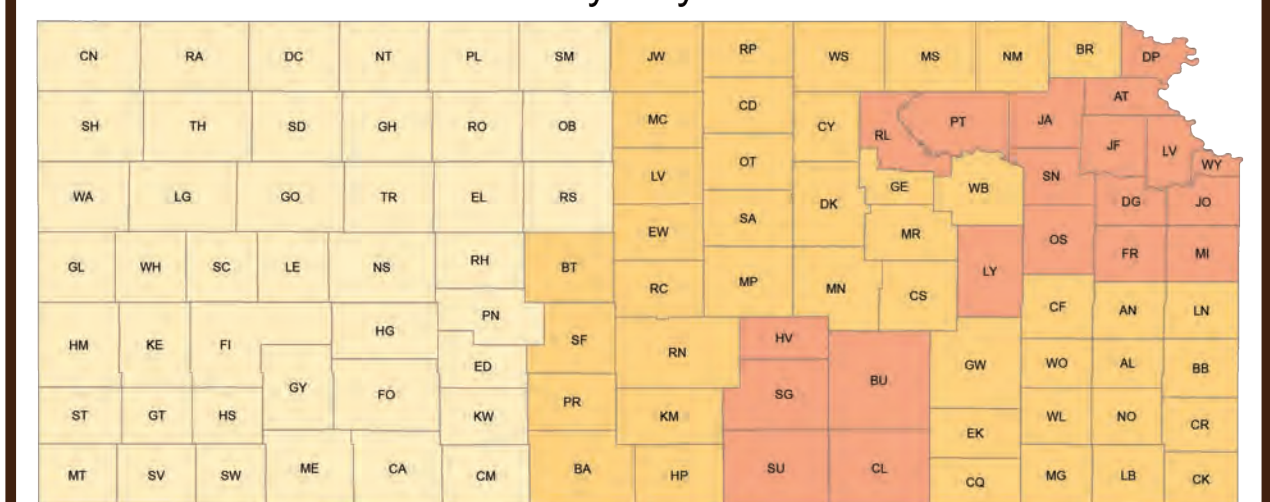
BENEFITS: The WIHA program may be more convenient for landowners who own land far from their home, who do not have time to worry about who is hunting on their land. The department publishes detailed atlases of properties enrolled in the program and hunters are asked not to contact landowners. Conservation officers will periodically patrol WIHA properties like other public hunting areas. The WIHA program provides hunters with a place to hunt while leaving the land in private ownership. Landowners can withdraw from the program at any time, but will be paid a prorated payment amount. Properties withdrawn after atlas production will be posted as no longer enrolled.

LIABILITY: State law provides that private individuals who lease their land to the state for recreational purposes are immune from damages or injuries that result from ordinary negligence.

RESTRICTIONS: Access is allowed by hunters during the posted access period only. Travel is limited to foot traffic only.

PAYMENTS: Maximum rates are identified in the map below. All rates are negotiable based on access period, location, habitat quality/ diversity, and size of enrolled properties. Fall lease payments are made around Dec.1 and spring-only leases receive payment around May 1 each year.

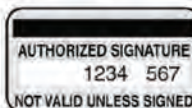

Multi-stemmed brush species – Roughleaf Dogwood

A couple of weeks ago, I referenced buckbrush management. A second multi-stemmed species of concern for us in our perennial forage systems is Roughleaf Dogwood.

One of the challenges with a roughleaf dogwood control program is how much later it comes on than buckbrush. Buckbrush gets to its optimum control window earlier than dogwood, which often doesn't exhibit its flat-topped clusters of white flowers until late

May or early June. In native grass pastures with regular burning, fire can keep it from getting started (see some Konza Prairie control differences in a recent First Friday Forage Focus on our Meadowlark Extension District Facebook page: <https://www.facebook.com/Meadowlarkextensiondistrict>). In cool season forage stands, or unburned warm season prairies, dogwood becomes difficult to remove once established.

Herbicide applications can be effective from the flower bud stage through early seed production. Many

Snapshot of April Kansas wheat crop conditions

A late March freeze, blustery days of blowing dust and predicted 80-degree afternoons — the dramatic spring-time weather in Kansas can leave everyone wondering what exactly is coming next, especially wheat producers watching their stands green up after the winter. Kansas Wheat caught up with farmer leaders from across the state to check on how this crop is stacking up compared to last year's drought-stricken fields.

According to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) crop progress report for the week ending April 7, 2024, winter wheat was rated at 49 percent good to excellent, 37 percent fair and 14 percent very poor to poor. A third of winter wheat, primarily in the southern tier and central-to-east regions of the state has jointed, ahead of both last year and the five-year average.

Producers are currently spraying a good stand of wheat for bugs and worms in far western Kansas, where Jason Ochs farms near Syracuse. The area is in a pocket of Kansas that received adequate, but extremely variable, moisture over the

winter, which was just enough to keep them out of drought status and maintain a good stand of wheat.

"The wheat drilled in absolutely beautifully, and we got a good stand right off the bat," he said. "It's a nice change."

The cold temperatures at the end of March did burn just the tips of wheat, but Ochs was more concerned about spraying and getting that next round of moisture than freeze damage. He reported the top two to four inches is starting to look pretty dry.

"We missed the last three or four moisture chances, so optimism is going down a little bit," Ochs said. "As of now, it looks like we are going to definitely raise above-average yields. I don't know how you cannot be a little excited about that."

A swath through central Kansas is in moderate drought, having missed out on the winter moisture that benefitted the western part of the state. That's certainly true where Martin Kerschen farms in Reno and Sedgwick counties. He reported that ponds are still dry, and the wheat is starting to show that blue

common herbicide active ingredients have some activity — but seldom result in what we'd consider great control. In fact, research with single active ingredient products like triclopyr or dicamba or picloram, even in combination with 2,4-D, seldom result in mortalities greater than 25 percent. Even 'good' control isn't great, with high volume treatments of multiple active ingredient products resulting in around 50 percent control. Single applications, even of multiple active ingredient products, likely won't eliminate roughleaf dogwood in a single

year, instead requiring a multi-year effort, possibly in combination with prescribed fire.

Herbicides may damage desirable grasses under the right conditions and all of the herbicides above will do significant damage to desirable legumes and other broadleaf forbs in forage stands. Always read and follow label directions prior to application. tint, indicating drought stress. He is also more concerned with the impact of upcoming 80-degree days this weekend than with the singed tops from the freeze late last month.

"Without moisture, it's not going to be the best of situations," Kerschen said. "But it looks a lot better right now than it did last year. That's one positive."

Near Plainville in north-central Kansas, Mike McClellan also feels like he's always waiting for moisture. He planted his wheat late, waiting for rains, and some of it did not come up until the first part of March. The late emergence prevented freeze damage since the wheat was not in as vulnerable of a growth stage.

"Most of the wheat in our area is really small and has taken off now, so that helped us get through the freeze okay," McClellan said. "Now we're starting to get some growth and all of a sudden we're starting to worry about moisture again."

With four days of wind at more than 40 miles per hour, that next rainfall event is critical. However, he pointed out that he did not cut any of his winter wheat last year, so this

year still has him feeling better about this crop's chances.

Further north, near the Nebraska border, Chris Tanner feels like the drought may finally be breaking where he farms around Norton. He had nice fall moisture to drill in his wheat and then had a couple of torrential downpours and a few snows that maintained good moisture.

"Our profiles are a lot better than we've had in the last three years," Tanner said. "It feels better coming out of a drought rather than going into it. We've done our time."

The wheat in this area was not far enough along to suffer from cold temperatures, but a few spotty fields are showing a little stress. At this point, however, he is feeling optimistic about this year's crop.

"We're a lot better off than we have been in the last several years," he said. "Right now, it's one of the better-looking crops that I've seen in the last ten years."

Legislation introduced to improve LIP

Legislation has been introduced in the U.S. Senate that would offer producers fairer market prices for livestock disaster assistance programs. The Livestock Indemnity Program Improvement Act would require the Farm Service Agency (FSA) to make quarterly updates to Livestock Indemnity Program (LIP) payment rates that reflect livestock market prices.

LIP provides payments to eligible livestock owners and contract growers for abnormal livestock deaths caused by an eligible loss condition, such as severe weather, disease or animal attack. Currently, FSA is required to update LIP payment rates annually. While the agency occasionally provides periodic price updates, the Livestock Indemnity Program Improvement Act would make these updates more frequent to reflect an ever-changing market.

"Natural disasters take a heavy toll on cattle producers, especially when severe weather leads to livestock losses," said Allison Rivera, NCBA executive director of government affairs. "Many producers rely on the Livestock Indemnity Program for support during these challenging times, but the program needs to be updated in a timely manner so that cattle producers are reimbursed for the full value of their lost cattle."

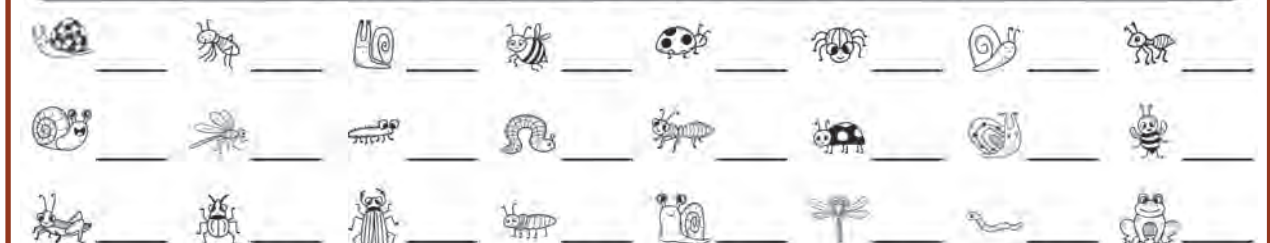
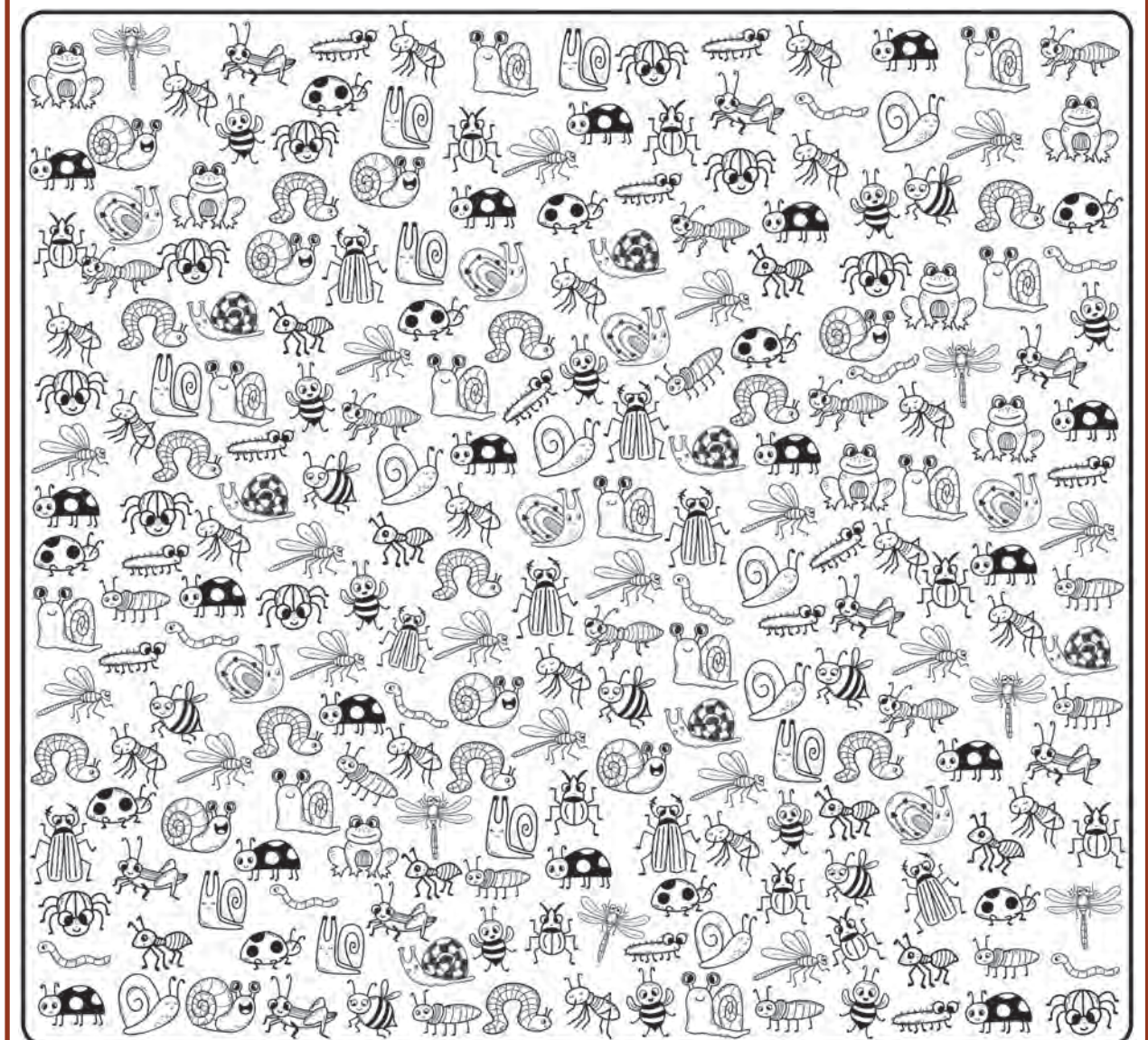

U.S. beef trade update

U.S. beef trade continues to evolve in the face of a unique domestic cattle market situation. Beef exports in February were down 1.3 percent year over year with the two-month total thus far in 2024 down 2.6 percent. This follows a 2023 year over year decrease of 14.3 percent from record 2022 beef exports.

Beef exports in the first two months of the year are down year over year from most of the top markets; including number one Japan, down 13.5 percent; number two South Korea, down 5.5 percent; and number three China/Hong Kong, down 2.6 percent. Additionally, Canada, the number five market is down 2.0 percent thus far in 2024, along with number six Taiwan, down 7.5 percent year over year. Mexico, which had been the number three market as recently as 2019, is currently the number four market but recovering. Beef exports to Mexico are up 20.7 percent in January-February, following a 12.2 percent year over year increase in 2023.

Beef imports in February were up 23.8 percent year over year and are up 31.9 percent in the first two months of the year. This fol-

lows a 9.9 percent year over year increase in beef imports in 2023. Beef imports this year are led by Brazil, who jumps out strongly to fill the "other country" quota early in the year, with shipments moderating after two or three months in the face of the over-quota tariff. Imports from Brazil are up 41.8 percent year over year thus far in 2024.

Imports from Australia are up sharply so far this year, with a year over year increase of 111.3 percent, still narrowly the number three country as a beef import source. Canada is the number two import source, slightly ahead of Australia and up 9.0 percent year over year. New Zealand is the number four beef import source and is up 48.6 percent thus far in 2024. Mexico is the fifth largest source of beef imports, down 16.9 percent in January-February after decreasing 12.4 percent year over year in 2023. Uruguay is the number six beef import source and is up 90.9 percent year over year thus far in 2024.

Beef exports continue to face headwinds as beef production decreases and beef prices increase in the U.S. market. A generally strong U.S. dollar adds additional headwinds, making U.S. beef im-

ports more expensive to international customers. At the same time, decreasing domestic beef supplies in the U.S., coupled with higher prices, attracts additional beef imports, with the strong dollar adding additional incentive for beef imports.

As is typical, beef imports are heavily dominated by imports of lean processing beef to supplement decreasing supplies of non-fed beef in the U.S. Decreasing lean beef supplies, coupled with strong ground beef demand in the U.S. is pushing 90 percent lean prices (and ground beef prices) to record levels. Fed beef (steer and heifer) production is declining, but the large percentage of yield grade 4 and 5 in feedlot cattle means that the supply of fatty (50 percent lean) trimmings is high relative to lean beef supplies and stimulating strong demand for domestic and imported lean processing beef to increase ground beef production.

Kansas grain stocks mixed

Kansas corn stocks in all positions on March 1, 2024 totaled 271 million bushels, up 14% from 2023, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Of the total, 110 million bushels are stored on farms, up 49% from a year ago. Off-farm stocks, at 161 million bushels, are down 2% from last year. Wheat stored in all positions totaled 158 million bushels, down 3% from a year ago. On-farm stocks of 7.00 million bushels are up 9% from 2023, but off-farm stocks of 151 million bushels are down 4% from last year. Sorghum stored in all positions totaled 68.0 million bushels, down 6% from 2023. On-farm stocks of 5.90 million bushels are down 2% from a year ago, and off-farm stocks of 62.1 million bushels are down 7% from last year. Soybeans stored in all positions totaled 59.8 million bushels, up slightly from last year. On-farm stocks of 23.5 million bushels are up 57% from a year ago but off-farm stocks, at 36.3 million bushels, are down 18% from 2023. Off-farm oat stocks of 907,000 bushels are up 61% from 2023. Off-farm barley stocks totaled 16,000 bushels.

Hay piles tend to get low this time of year, animals are reaching through fences to nibble green grass shoots on the other side and producers might be growing tired of the chore of feeding. All this signals that spring is here and "turn-out time" isn't far away, especially on our cool season pastures. Some recent rains make it seem like we might have grass, but are you, the livestock and most importantly - the pasture, ready? Let's take a look today at planning checklist for this busy time of year.

The green grass and high market prices may make it seem like an attractive option to put as many animals as possible

out on new tender growth. Is that the best choice long-term for the operation? Do you have a business plan? Grazing plan? Livestock health and management plan? It can be very tempting to get "grass fever" and divert from well thought out plans, especially with the outlook for good market prices on the backside of the grazing season. If you find yourself there, take a moment to reflect on the plans, remember you are operating a business, and ask yourself the following:

- What is the plan for weed/brush control, fertilizer, grazing management and proper pasture management to insure the grazing system stays ahead of grazing pressure for plant benefits?

- What is your planned stocking rate? Will forage production

be expected to match that rate this year or is adjustment needing to be considered?

- Do you have a plan for drought, reduced forage production or water systems issues and have planned alternate locations for the livestock?

- Have risk management tools for forage and livestock production been put in place, such as PRF or LRP? If you haven't looked at these tools, think about them prior to sign-up deadlines.

- Is there a component of the livestock operation that can be rotated to different forages, moved to dry lot or marketed early?

- Has an adequate rest period been planned for the plant recovery to build carbohydrate root reserves? Planning rest may be more important than

planning grazing!

- What is the harvested forage and/or feed plan for next winter? Do you know how many days you need to be grazing and subsequently feeding supplemental feed with these inventories?

- Has the flock/herd been given pre-breeding vaccinations and been treated for parasites?

- Will the livestock be in adequate body condition for the onset of breeding season? If not, does supplemental feed exist to get them into proper condition or should breeding be delayed?

- Are replacement females at a proper age and target weight to breed up quickly?

- Have the breeding males undergone a breeding soundness exam and ready physically?

- Is ample sire power on hand to cover all the females early in the breeding season? Do you have a plan if there aren't enough breeding males or if injuries occur?

- Should artificial insemination be part of your operation, do you have semen and supplies needed to synchronize estrus and efficiently AI?

This isn't a comprehensive list by any means, but are good points to think about if you haven't yet. This is the time of year and a good market year, when it is easy to get excited and have much optimism about the livestock business. It is also time to be planning for the future and keeping the business poised for economic sustainability into that future.

February pork exports remain robust; strong month for beef export value

Fueled by growth in the Western Hemisphere, South Korea and Australia, U.S. pork exports posted another excellent performance in February, according to data released by USDA and compiled by the U.S. Meat Export Federation (USMEF). Beef export volume was slightly lower year-over-year, but export value climbed by 10%.

Mexico still the pacesetter, but pork export growth widespread

February pork exports increased 14% from a year ago to 250,930 metric tons (mt), while value jumped 15% to \$685.1 million. Through the first two months of 2024, exports increased 10% in both volume (502,354 mt) and value (\$1.37 billion). Exports to leading market Mexico are well ahead of last year's record pace, while shipments are also trending higher to Korea, Central and South America, Oceania and the Caribbean.

"Coming off a record value year, it's great to see broad-based momentum for pork exports continue globally into 2024," said USMEF president and CEO Dan Halstrom. "While Mexico is certainly at the forefront, we are seeing excellent growth in markets like Colombia, Chile, El Salvador and the Caribbean, and demand has rebounded impressively in Korea and Australia."

Beef export value

climbs in many key regions

Beef exports reached 103,883 mt in February, down 1% from a year ago, but export value increased 10% to \$830.4 million. January-February exports were also down 1% to 203,647 mt, with export value climbing 9% to \$1.59 billion.

February beef exports to the Caribbean were the largest on record, while demand from Mexico and Central and South America continued to trend higher. Exports also increased year-over-year to Taiwan, and Korea posted an increase in export value.

"Tight beef supplies are definitely a challenge for exporters, and that situation isn't

going to change anytime soon," Halstrom said. "But on a positive note, we are seeing more opportunities for underutilized beef cuts, including the round, shoulder clod and variety meat, in the global marketplace. Demand is strong throughout the Western Hemisphere and the foodservice and hospitality sectors are finally gaining some momentum in key Asian markets such as Korea, where the post-COVID recovery has been slower than anticipated."

February lamb exports well above year-ago totals

U.S. lamb exports followed a strong January with another robust performance in February, climbing 11% from a year ago to 270 mt.

MU Extension recruiting farmers for grassland improvement project

University of Missouri Extension is recruiting farmers for a project aimed at improving the productivity of forage-based operations in areas dominated by tall fescue grass.

Participating operations would work with Extension specialists to implement grassland

management practices that are known to improve productivity and provide environmental benefits, according to Harley Naumann, MU Extension state specialist in forage and grazing management. Operations will be compensated for their participation.

"This grant represents an investment in Missouri farmers and ranchers that are interested in improving productivity of their grazing lands using climate-smart production practices," Naumann said. "Implementing climate smart agriculture practices in Missouri is not a one-size-fits-all proposition. I look forward to assisting Missouri farmers and ranchers with implementing climate-smart practices in forage livestock systems that are functionally adaptable to individual production goals and objectives."

The project is an ini-

tiative of the Grasslands Partnership (www.grasslandpartnership.org), which is organized by extension services in nine states within the "tall fescue belt." Funding is through the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service's Climate Smart Commodities program.

Practices farms could implement under the program include:

- Establishing native warm-season grass pastures.
- Improving grazing management.
- Interseeding legumes as alternative nitrogen sources.
- Establishing perennial field buffers.

Creating silvopasture by adding trees to existing pasture.

Amending soil with biochar or gypsum.

In addition to incentive payments, expected benefits include forage drought resilience, improved soil and water quality and wildlife habitat, said Naumann. Developing carbon and environmental benefits can lead to a carbon market that may offer producers an alternative income source.

Participating producers will work with Extension specialists to determine which practices best fit the farm. Ideally, each farm will use three or more prac-

tices, with each practice implemented on a different pasture. A separate pasture must be maintained with your typical management practices so the Grasslands Partnership can compare outcomes. Participants are also expected to keep records on implementation of the practices; allow access to their farms for pasture assessment, soil sampling and other monitoring; and host two field days during the five-year course of the project.

Inaugural Red Angus Youth Expo approaching

The phenotype-genotype show will require judges to evaluate each animal's genetic profile along with their phenotype, and will provide juniors an opportunity to learn about the role of EPDs and selection indexes in seedstock selection. The inaugural Premium Red Baldy and American Red female shows will champion the commercial cattle industry and provide education about RAAA's value-added programs.

A non-terminal carcass contest will be held using ultrasound technology. This contest is designed to reflect fed cattle marketing grids used in the industry, while rewarding animals reaching industry ideals for carcass weight, quality grade and yield grade. Steers enrolled in the carcass contest are also eligible to show in either the purebred steer show or the percentage steer show.

New study shows effectiveness of American Lamb Checkoff Program

The American Lamb Checkoff Program has substantially increased the annual value of American Lamb despite the modest funding available for promotion, according to the Texas A&M University 2024 report "Return on Investment in the American Lamb Checkoff Program" conducted by agricultural economists Dr. Gary Williams and Dr. Oral Capps, Jr.

According to the study, lamb consumption increased by \$1.17 billion to \$1.31 billion. Researchers attributed the increase to ALB's promotional efforts, which increased both lamb consumption rates and retail lamb prices. This "lift" resulted in an average annual growth of between \$58.7 million and \$62.4 million.

"The purpose of the Lamb Checkoff has been to increase demand for American Lamb," says ALB chairman Jeff Ebert. "The results of this

study confirm that despite a small budget, ALB's promotional efforts have successfully resulted in increased demand for lamb."

In this study, researchers also found an increase in consumption value to be an impressive metric of program success, citing that checkoff expenditures amounted to only about 0.04% of the total value of consumption over that period. Compared to the value of lamb consumed annually, the Lamb Checkoff program spends extremely little on lamb promotion. For every \$100 in retail revenue from lamb, only about 4.3 cents were spent to promote lamb consumption.

The study also examined the demand for lamb related to income and found that per capita income has "become a statistically significant driver for the demand for lamb." This finding is important because it implies that more lamb is sold as

the economy and consumer incomes grow. The study found that a 10 percent increase in income results in a 2.7 percent increase in the demand for lamb.

Regarding competitive meats, beef prices are the most significant driver influencing lamb demand. A 10 percent increase in the price of beef results in about a 6.8 percent increase in the demand for lamb. On a smaller scale, a 10 percent increase in the price of pork correlates to a 1.2 percent increase in the demand for lamb. There was no correlation related to poultry prices; therefore, the study indicates that consumers do not consider lamb a substitute meat for that market.

Another measure of the checkoff program contribution is the cost-to-benefit ratio. The Texas A&M study reported that the average return to industry stakeholders was approximately \$16.60 for each promotional \$1 invested. The study concluded that for every dollar in additional assessment NOT paid by stakeholders and thus not spent on lamb promotion, industry stakeholders lose an average of \$16.60 in potential additional industry revenue.

Finding the "silver lining" in cotton gin waste

Cotton gin waste, also known as cotton gin trash, is a byproduct of the cotton ginning process and occurs when the cotton fibers are separated from the seed boll. For cotton gin waste, the treasure is its hidden potential to transform silver ions into silver nanoparticles and create a new hybrid material that could be used to add antimicrobial properties to consumer products, like aerogels, packaging, or composites.

Silver nanoparticles are highly sought-after products in the nanotechnology industry because of their antibacterial, antifungal, antiviral, electrical, and optical properties. These nanoparticles have an estimated global production of 500 tons per year and are widely applied to consumer goods such as textiles, coatings, paints, pigments, electronics, optics, and packaging.

In a study published in ACS Omega, researchers from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA)'s Agricultural Research Service (ARS) revealed the ability of cotton gin waste to synthesize and generate silver nanoparticles in the

presence of silver ions.

"Our method not only lets cotton gin waste act as chemical agents for producing silver nanoparticles, which makes it cost-effective and environmentally friendly but also enables embedding the nanoparticles within the cotton gin waste matrix," said Sunghyun Nam, research engineer at ARS's Cotton Chemistry and Utilization Research Unit in New Orleans. "By embedding them in the cotton gin waste, these materials acquire antimicrobial properties."

Nam said the researchers used a simple heat treatment of cotton gin waste materials in water containing silver ions that produced silver nanoparticles without the need for additional chemical agents.

This finding is significant since making silver nanoparticles usually requires chemical agents which can be costly and pose environmental concerns. Embedding nanoparticles into a material can also be challenging.

Developing nanoparticle embedding technology is not new for Nam and her team. They previously developed washable antimicrobial wipes by

using raw cotton fiber that produced silver nanoparticles inside the fiber. The embedded silver nanoparticles can continue to kill harmful bacteria wash after wash.

Large quantities of cotton gin waste are generated annually, and the cotton ginning industry is always seeking new sustainable processes that upcycle

crop residue.

"Our research paves the way for new material applications of cotton gin waste that can protect against microbial contamination," said Nam.

A provisional patent application on the self-embedding silver nanoparticle biomass waste compositions has recently been filed.

New feed guide highlights benefits of canola on the dairy

The Canola Council of Canada (CCC) has recently released the seventh edition of the Canola Meal Dairy Feeding Guide, a comprehensive guide on the use of canola meal in dairy cattle diets. The guide summarizes the latest research and gives nutritionists and dairy producers a tool to better understand the economic and animal performance benefits of feeding canola meal.

"This guide is a one-stop shop on canola meal," said Brittany Wood, director of Canola Utilization with the CCC. "We update the guide every few years when there's a significant body of data that helps expand our understanding and gives end users of canola meal a greater depth of information on how to feed it to dairy cows."

Since the previous edition in 2019, a considerable amount of additional research regarding the feeding of canola meal has been conducted, including:

- Updated nutrient profiles and digestibility values for solvent extracted and expeller canola meal

- Findings regarding the use of canola meal for early lactation, using canola meal to support milk production throughout the lactation cycle

- Results from studies showing the ability of canola meal to support gut health

- The contribution of canola meal supporting environmental sustainability on the dairy

- Expanded research on feeding canola meal to dairy calves and heifers

"Our goal has always been to ensure anyone formulating rations has the most accurate information possible," added Essi Evans, Ph.D., E+E Technical Advisory Services. "This guide includes decades of research and is regularly revised to keep it up to date."

Research-proven results

The new research in the Canola Meal Dairy

Feeding Guide aims to address two key concerns of nutritionists regarding feed formulation with canola meal — profitability and environmental sustainability.

Several field trials highlighted in the guide have shown canola meal can improve profitability. One trial conducted in Wisconsin involving 1,295 mid-lactation cows showed a significant improvement in income over feed costs. The ration, formulated to contain 7.5 pounds (3.4 kilograms) of dry matter from canola meal/cow/day, reduced ration costs while increasing milk production.

"We've known for probably two decades that there's a milk production advantage when feeding canola meal, but we haven't had the full picture of why that happens," said Wood. "With each version of the guide, we're adding new pages to the story, so to speak, to provide a well-rounded picture based on cur-

rent research."

This economic benefit also influences environmental sustainability. Research in the Feeding Guide shows that canola meal contributes to reducing methane emissions in lactating dairy cows, providing an economical way to lower enteric methane and nitrous oxide output, the two greenhouse gases of greatest importance in livestock production. This same research also demonstrates that while enteric methane is lowered, milk production is increased.

Growing use of canola in the diets

As canola meal in dairy cattle rations continues to gain popularity the U.S., the feed guide aims to provide practical information for formulating diets with canola.

"The guide does a really nice job summarizing the literature for production, digestibility, amino acids and more," said Jordan Kuehn, Ph.D., a dairy consultant with Renais-

sance Nutrition. "It's a nice blend of the practical and the theoretical. Producers can see how cows performed production-wise for canola versus other protein sources, and nutritionists can dive deeper into digestibility information."

Kuehn, whose graduate research on the use of canola meal in early lactation is featured in the guide, says

he's seen more and more producers using canola meal over time. "Producers can see that canola meal results are backed by research and can make sense from both the production response side and the economic side."
